Student Achievement

We measure student achievement based on our annual student survey at the end of each academic year. This survey asks students to report the degree to which the program provided them a solid start on acquiring the basic knowledge, skills, and values included in the 17 educational components of planning education as defined by the Planning Accreditation Board. Based on responses to our 2014, 2015 and 2016 annual student surveys, students gave our overall planning curriculum a grade of A-. In ratings of all 17 areas related to core knowledge, skills, and values of the profession (as defined by the Planning Accreditation Board), MURP students graded our program as a B or above.

Forty-one MURP students were recognized in the 2010-2013 three-year period by national, regional, and campus awards, scholarships, and fellowships for academic achievements. Almost 15 students per graduating cohort receiving such recognition is consistent with our goal of increasing the ability of our students to attract awards, scholarships, and other forms of recognition.
